

Although John Green wrote the book, he didn't write the film version. Instead, a team of specialist 'screenwriters' adapted his story for the big screen.

Paper Towns wasn't the first novel by John Green to make it to the big screen. His 2012 story about two teenagers with cancer, The Fault in Our Stars, was turned into a movie in 2014.

The book is one of the best selling novels for young adults of all time. The movie was even more successful, racking up a whopping £196 million in ticket sales.



The books of English writer Charles Dickens have proved hugely popular with filmmakers. According to the Internet Movie Database, his novels have inspired over 340 films and TV shows!












Claim to fame


