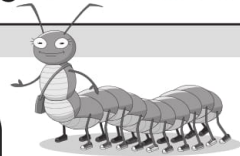

When your child has read a story, ask them which character they liked best and which character they liked least, and why.



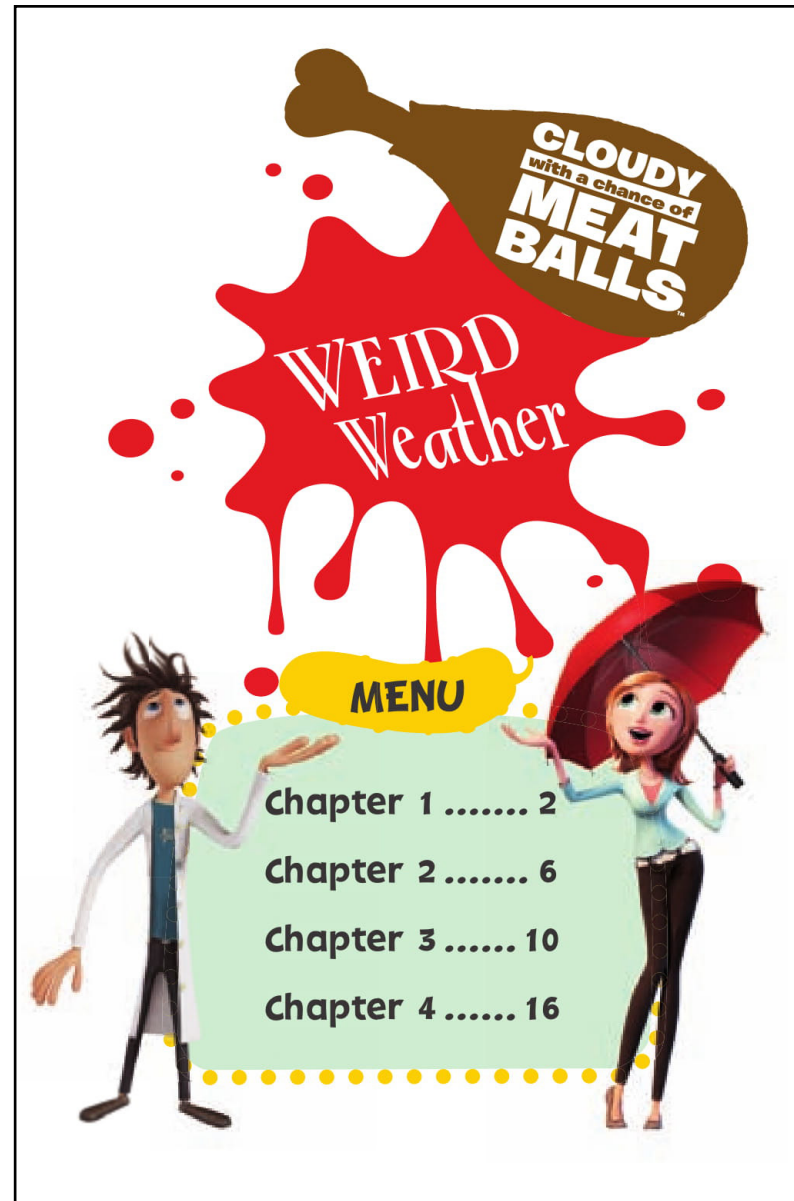
Story detectives
