# FULL FLIGHT HEROES AND HEROINES: 3Dee

#### **About the Author**

Danny Pearson is both a writer and editor of children's books. His other Badger titles are 'Beekeeper' and 'Alien Eggs'.

#### Genre

3Dee is an action story with a fantasy (magical) twist.

#### **Summary**

Dee works in a film rental store. When an old man tries to return a video tape she tells him rudely he will have to pay a large fine. He refuses but leaves the tape with his membership card.

Dee plays the tape. At first it seems to be blank but then there is an image of the old man smiling. Outside Dee hears screams. A Godzilla-type monster is tearing up the city, followed by aliens intent on destruction. She is saved by Arnold Van Damme, the Hollywood actor who insists he is Max Atom, action hero.

Dee realises that the old man is at the root of this. She tracks him down. He says it's really her fault because she was so rude to him. Max forces him to tell them how to put things right. All they have to do is rewind the video tape. Dee is hailed as a hero.

#### **Book Introduction**

- What can children predict about the story by looking at the cover?
- What do you think the title might mean? (If necessary prompt the answer 3D.)
- What does 'three dimensional' mean?
- How does this change what you think might happen in the story?
- Work out what genre this might be?

#### **Discussion points**

- How many different monsters or baddies did you spot? [Godzilla/giant dinosaur, aliens, alien robot and the old man.]
- Who does the author want you to think of when he mentions Arnold Van Damme? [Arnold Schwarzenegger and Jean-Claude Van Damme.]
- What is your favourite part of the story?
- What do you think is the author's view of bad manners?

#### **Pair work**

- List three of your favourite monsters or baddies that the author could have included in the story.
- Which films do you think the author was thinking about when he wrote this book? [Maybe: Godzilla, Independence Day, The Terminator, The Iron Giant, War of the Worlds, Jurassic Park...]

Think of a good 'baddy' name for the old man.

## Extension 1 (literacy)

A proverb is a short saying that is traditional but has some truth in it, too. For example: An apple a day keeps the doctor away.

This is a traditional saying but we now know that apples contain lots of vitamin C which helps us to stay healthy.

Make up a proverb for Dee. For example: A thank you a day keeps the monsters away.

Make up a proverb for the chief baddy. For example: A monster a day helps me work, rest and play.

## Extension 2 (cross curricular)

What was the first 3D feature film ever shown to a paying audience? [Answer: 'The Power of Love' in 1922.]
