bridegrooms

A **bridegroom** is a man who is getting married.

# **bridge** noun bridges

A **bridge** is something that is built over a river, a road, or a railway so that people can get across it.

Our house is just across the bridge.

# bright adjective

brighter, brightest

- 1 A **bright** colour is very easy to see. She wore a **bright** red dress.
- 2 Something that is **bright** shines with a lot of light.

The sun is very **bright** today.

# brilliant adjective

Something that is **brilliant** is very good. I thought the film was **brilliant**.

# **bring** verb brings, bringing, brought

If you **bring** something, you take it with you when you go somewhere.

You can bring a friend to the party.

# broke

⇒ Look at **break**.

I'm sorry I **broke** the radio.



If something is **broken**, it is in pieces. All of his toys are **broken**.

#### broom noun

brooms

A **broom** is a brush with a long handle that you use to sweep the floor.

### brother noun

brothers

Your **brother** is a boy or a man who has the same mother and father as you do.

# brought

Look at **bring**.

We brought some food for the picnic.

brown noun/adjective

**Brown** is the colour of earth or wood. Her eyes are dark **brown**.

## bruise noun

bruises

A **bruise** is a purple mark on your skin that appears if something hits a part of your body.

She has a big bruise on her leg.

## brush noun

brushes

A **brush** has lots of short hairs fixed to a handle. You use a **brush** to make your hair tidy, to clean things, or to paint.



bubbles

A **bubble** is a small ball of liquid with air inside it.

### bucket noun

buckets

A **bucket** is a deep, round container with a handle that you use to hold or carry liquids.

# buckle noun

buckles

A **buckle** is something you use to fasten a belt, a shoe or a bag.

#### bud noun

buds

A **bud** is a small, new part on a tree or plant that grows into a leaf or a flower.

# budgie noun

budgies

**Budgies** are small brightly-coloured birds, often kept as pets.

# build verb

builds, building, built

If you **build** something, you make it by putting the parts of it together.

They're **building** houses in the field.

# **building** noun buildings

A **building** is a place with walls and a roof. Houses, shops and schools are all **buildings**.

### built

Look at build.

We built our house on a hill.

#### bulb noun

bulbs

A **bulb** is the part of a lamp that is made of glass and gives out light.

We need a new bulb in the kitchen.

#### bull noun

bulls

A bull is a male cow. Bulls have horns.

## bump verb

bumps, bumping, bumped

If you **bump** something, or **bump** into it, you hit it without meaning to.

I **bumped** the table with my bag.

# bunch noun

bunches

A **bunch** of things is a group of them. He held a **bunch** of flowers.

# bundle noun

bundles

A **bundle** is a lot of clothes, sticks or other things that are fastened together.

## buried

Dook at **bury**.

We buried the box in the garden.
