good story should grab your reader's attention from the very first line. This doesn't mean you have to start your story with a huge explosion – although you can if you want to!

A mystery might begin with a dead body being discovered, whilst if you're writing a funny story you want to start with something that will leave your reader in stitches. Whatever type of story you want to tell, try to set the right tone from the very start.
